Collection Drive for Developmentally Disabled

Brothers, Sister Columbiettes and Friends, I am the Co-Chairman of our annual "Shake the Can" Drive. This Drive collects monies for Developmentally Disabled Persons...children and adults in our community.

A small amount of the monies we collect (10%) is sent to the NJ State Council for their distribution to State charities that assist these children and adults. Therefore, 90% of our efforts directly benefit people with developmental disabilities in Bergenfield, Dumont and several Bergen County agencies. In 2015 we collected \$10035; and in 2016 we collected \$8066. The difference is in the help available.

This year, Dumont Police Chief Conner has graciously permitted us to seek donations at the intersection of Washington and Madison Avenue in Dumont. This is a "high volume" location that will allow us to increase the monies we can collect. I say "can" collect because we need everyone to respond to the phone call you will receive from me or my Co-Chairman George DiCostanzo asking you to donate 2-3 hours of your time during the Drive.

Our Shake the Can drive will run from Thursday April 20 to Sunday April 23, 2017. I need members "to work the streets" on Thursday April 20, Friday April 21, Saturday April 22 and Sunday morning April 23.

If you can't help in the streets, George needs your help seeking donations in front of several stores in Bergenfield and Dumont. He needs 40 volunteers per day for Thurs-Sat.

This Drive really makes an impression on our Community. It puts us, the Knights of Columbus, physically in front of our Community. This Drive shows our Community what the Knights of Columbus is all about—adhering to the First Principle of our Order - Charity.

"Be Not Afraid...Becoming Missionary Disciples" was the them, and on Sat morning, Mar 4, men from all around the Archdiocese of Newark – and the tri-state area – gathered at Seton Hall Univ for the annual Catholic Men's Commission.

His Eminence, Joseph Cardinal Tobin, opened his first Men's Commission as Archbishop of Newark. His greeting was warm and pastoral as he thanked those in attendance for spending a day in prayer and reflection one week into Lent. What better way to enter into this Holy Season of Lent and consider our role as missionary disciples of Christ.

The true highlight of the day was the keynote address from His Eminence, Sean Cardinal O'Malley, Cardinal-Archbishop of Boston. Both he and Cardinal Tobin are close advisors to His Holiness, Pope Francis. The Pope, a Jesuit; Cardinal Tobin, a Redemptorist; and Cardinal O'Malley, a Franciscan; are welcoming Catholics back into the Church with their message that all are welcome and have a place within the house of God.

The Men's Commission has come a long way since the first year when we gathered on the ice at South Mountain Arena. It was also very cold on that day but the day of prayer and reflection always warms your heart and prepares you to celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday. I would encourage all my Brother Knights to join the Commission next year.
