On Wednesday April 11, 2018, our Council continues its great work at the Hackensack Shelter. St. John's Council participates in The Family Promise of Bergen Country Program in which we feed the homeless. Our Council participated in the Program this past January. It was a personal revelation for me. The food we provide is consumed by more than just the homeless. There are many people who may be unemployed, are in low paying jobs, or who are just experiencing personal challenges in their lives who come to the Shelter for a good meal.

We prepare the food the night before (April 10th 2018) and could use your help in that preparation as well. We also encourage everyone to donate food and bring it to the Council on April 11th, 2018 so we can bring it the Shelter. We fed over 140 people in January.

We need 12-15 Brothers, Columbiettes and Scouts to help transport the food from the Council to the shelter, feed the people who come, and clean up. We leave the Council around 3:30 pm, the food is served at 5pm, and we are back at the Council by 7pm.
