CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

Last month at the Conference of Catholic Bishop's meeting the bishop's approved the opening of the cause for canonization of Mother Mary Teresa Tallon (1867-1954). Mother Tallon was born in Upstate New York and founded a new congregation of women religious known as the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate. Their motherhouse is located in Monroe, New York not too far from here. At the center of their spirituality, the sisters in the example of Mother Tallon visit people in their homes who have either fallen away from the Church or are inactive with the Church. Their mission is to bring them back to the faith as part of the New Evangelization of the Church. A daring task indeed yet one that reminds us that we are all called to Evangelize in some way the faith to other people. Let us pray for Mother Tallon's canonization and follow here example of inviting people back to the practice of their faith. Here is an excerpt from her writings about preparing for Christmas during this season of Advent:

"Our Lord began His apostolate by attracting the poor shepherds to His Crib, and they, poor and simple, opened the way for the Magi-Kings. Our Lord in His Crib is the Model of every virtue. There He is, cold and trembling, weeping as any other child might, yet He does not work any miracle to alleviate His pain, the only miracle He works is to gain strength to suffer more. He will give us, too, the grace to suffer generously, if we will only be brave and noble for Him. Our Lord not only bore the trials connected with His Infancy, but also those of His whole future life by anticipation."

May the Christ Child inspire us this Christmas to serve Him more. Have a Blessed Advent!!!

The Twelve James the Greater & James the Younger

James the Greater - was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus and the agony in Gethsemane. Holy Scripture describes James as one of Jesus' favored apostles in his inner circle.

We know little of this Apostle other than that his fearless confession before King Herod so moved the public prosecutor that he declared himself a Christian on the spot. Accused and accuser were hurried off together to execution. Even in the face of death, James never lost his faith or his courage.

James the Younger – is also thought to be called "James the Less". James was likely Jesus' cousin and was the brother of St. Jude Thaddeus. He was certainly close to Jesus because Jesus appeared to him separately after His Resurrection. It is further believed that James was present when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' followers and sent them out to spread the Gospel.

James remained firm in his faith spending much of his time in prayer that his knees thickened like a camel's. While serving as Jerusalem's first bishop, he was arrested by the authorities and killed.
