Grand Knight's Message

Dear Brother Knights, Sister Columbiette's, Scouts and Friends,

The Christmas Season is upon us and I take this opportunity in my Message to wish everyone a happy and holy Christmas. We celebrate the birth of our Savior on Christmas Day and our message as Catholics and Knights of Columbus must be "Keep Christ in Christmas". The rigors of daily life sometimes take all of us "off message" during this wonderful Season but, let each of us, in our own way, dedicate ourselves to the true spirit of Christmas- that Jesus was sent by the Father to be among us.

In the spirit of Christmas, I bring to everyone another endeavor that our council wishes to take on. Evangelism is defined as a "preaching of or a zealous effort to spread the Gospel". One of our Brothers, Innocent Amaefule, asks for our Council's help in spreading the Catholic Faith and to extend Evangelism in his homeland of Nigeria. Innocent's sister, Ngozi, operates a Catholic school in Nigeria called the Bernard School. It is a Catholic School whose mission is to spread God's Word as seen in the Gospel and to teach the children in Nigeria the lessons of God's love and mercy as taught to us by his Son Jesus.

The Bernard School needs our help to carry out its mission. The school needs school supplies- backpacks, notebooks, pens, pencils, binders (and whatever else you can think of). The Bernard School is not subsidized by the Nigerian government. The Bernard School is losing students to non-Christian schools because they don't have enough of the basic supplies to "compete" with the non-Christian schools. I am told that students want to enroll at Bernard, but they won't enroll there because the non-Christian schools can offer more to the student.

We will therefore, collect school supplies for the Bernard school at our Council Christmas Party and throughout the month of December. I ask for your help in this important endeavor. We can make a difference in our world in 2018 and beyond by assisting and bringing a stronger presence of the Catholic Church to Nigeria.

Our Council will also continue with our Food Collection Drive during the month of December and my officers and I ask that you continue your generosity in the donation of food for our Brothers and Sisters in Puerto Rico. Brothers Willie Cintron and Juan Melendez lead this effort on behalf of our Council. Everyone should know that Juan packed all of the food we received during our first Drive and sent it directly to his sister in Puerto Rico who distributed it to her neighbors in need. It's great to say that we know that our food reached people who really need our help. We will have containers in the Council through the end of December to collect your food donations.

As everyone can see this Council continues to do great things.
