CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

We enter into the month of February and normally Lent would begin sometime this month but because Easter is late this year, on April 20, Ash Wednesday will not occur until March 5. So February is a month of Ordinary Time, when the cold of winter is at its peak and we long for the warm months ahead. During this month let us take courage from the holy men and women before us who we commemorate this month like: St. Claudine Thevenet (February 4), St. Agatha (February 5), St. Josephine Bakhita (February 8), St. Scholastica (February 10), and St. Valentine (February 14).

On February 3 we remember a woman who is up for canonization, Mary Elizabeth Lange from Baltimore, Maryland. She lived from 1784-1882. She was an emancipated Haitian slave who settled in the city of Baltimore. Mary Elizabeth Lange saw that there was no education for black children so she opened the first school for them in Baltimore. With the help of the Sulpician Fathers she established an academy for girls and founded an order of Religious Sisters known as the Oblate Sisters of Providence. This was the first religious order for women of African descent.

During her long life, Mother Mary Elizabeth opened more schools, orphanages and helped nurse the victims of the cholera epidemic that hit Baltimore. She fought against racism and believed in the dignity of every person. Jesus' message of mercy and love was at the heart of Mother Lange's life. She died on February 3, 1882. If you go to the Motherhouse of the Oblate Sisters of Providence and visit their chapel you will find the remains of Mother Lange there. Someday soon we will be honoring the first Haitian American saint, Mary Elizabeth Lange.

May her message and example warm our hearts during the cold month of February.
