CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

On Wednesday, February 18 we begin the Holy Season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. A time for us Christians to reflect more intensely on our spiritual lives. See what faults we have committed and make amends. It's a 40 day period for us to change our lives in some way, even in a small way. The saints did this in their own lives. They were not perfect but on the spiritual journey they learned how to become better individuals. They are our examples.

One such saint who can act as a Lenten Guide for us is St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother (Feast day is February 27). He reflected a great deal during his short life on the Passion and death of Our Savior and on the Sorrows of Mary. As you read his story here ask St. Gabriel to help you make the most of this Lenten Season by helping you to make a total change of heart.

- St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother (1838-1862), who was born to a large family in Assisi, surprised his friends and family when, at sixteen, he announced his intention to join the Passionist order. Hardly a model of piety, he was known among his friends as a lighthearted prankster and something of a dandy. Unbeknownst to others, however, he had made a vow, during a serious illness, that if he recovered he would enter religious life. Afterward he could not be dissuaded.
- St. Gabriel applied himself avidly to his spiritual formation, seeking in all things to find the way to holiness. "I will attempt day by day to break my will into pieces", he wrote. "I want to do God's Holy Will, not my own." After continuously rejecting Gabriel's plea to practice more severe mortifications, his spiritual director finally, as a lesson in humility, ordered him to wear a barbed chain outside his clothing, "so that all may see what a man of great mortification you are." Gabriel complied cheerfully.

After only four years in religious life Gabriel showed the first sign of tuberculosis. As his condition worsened, all were struck by his ability to maintain his good cheer and gentleness. He died on February 27, 1862. Canonized in 1920, he was declared a patron of Catholic youth.
