Religious & Civil Rights Report

On Sunday, November 24th, an incident took place in Argentina that was one of the greatest witnesses to our Catholic faith that I have ever seen. For me this incident, which was captured in a YouTube video, was more powerful than any fiery homily or politically influenced diatribe by one of the two branches of 'partisan' Catholics.

Approximately 7000 radical feminists, and their male supports, converged on Buenos Aires for the National Women's Encounter. This is a government sponsored annual gathering that takes place in Argentina and usually deteriorates into vandalism against churches and violence against Catholics.

Because the mob actions were anticipated approximately 1500 Catholic men surrounded the Cathedral and locked arms creating a human barrier. They prayed the rosary and came face to face with manifest evil. That is the only way to describe the actions of the topless mob of women who spit in the faces of these men, cursed them, spray painted them and in a final act burned Pope Francis in effigy. The real story here is the men. After my initial reaction of outrage I watched the video again and this time all I saw were men of God acting exactly how Christ taught us to act in the face of the evil that corrupts the hearts of so many in the world. This is what it looks like to be a Christian. More specifically this is what it looks like to be a Catholic, Christian man. They displayed strength without loss of love and passive resistance without fear or weakness.

I pray that if I ever stand against something this nefarious I can do so with the same prayerful dignity that these brothers from Argentina display. *Powerful.*
