CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

During the month of June we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit which is the birthday of the Church. I share with you here an excerpt from a homily given by the great German Theologian, Karl Rahner (1904-1984).

"Pentecost completes Easter, for Pentecost is the completion of the saving events celebrated during the Easter season. We celebrated these events by recalling the sacrificial death of the Lord, his victorious resurrection, and his entrance- by means of his ascension- into his Father's eternity. All these events took place so that the Holy Spirit might become our portion. All these events have but one goal: to redeem the world and the human beings in it, and to give God himself to this redeemed world. That is why Pentecost is the fulfillment of Easter.

The reason why the glowing love of the Father and the Son has descended into our hearts is that the Father's own Son has brought our humanity back into the Father's light. The reason why one can live God's own life in the Holy Spirit is that the Son of man died according to the flesh. The Holy Spirit of the eternal God has come. He is here: he lives in us, he sanctifies us, he strengthens us, he consoles us. He is the pledge of eternal life, the earnest of absolute triumph."

By right of our Baptism and Confirmation we have received the Holy Spirit, may the Spirit strengthen us and encourage us to be faithful followers of Jesus Christ and empower us to be active members of his Church.

Troop 1345 Boy Scouts Report

Troop 1345 sent a large delegation of 32 people to the New Jersey State Police Camporee in Sea Girt NJ on May 16-17-18. This was one of the largest scouting events in the nation for 2014, with some 10,000 scouts participating along with the State Police and National Guard.

As part of the event, the troop participated in the Messengers of Peace initiative through the Boy Scouts of America, which includes millions of young men and women working towards peace in over 220 countries.

One of the objectives of the initiative from the Boy Scouts perspective is to increase community involvement through service projects, something that Troop 1345 already has a strong legacy of providing for its community.

Troop 1345¢s last weekly meeting of the season will be held on June 17, at which time they will begin their summer õbreakö. The troop will be participating in several summer activities, including summer camp in New York, whitewater

rafting on the Lehigh River, and several Eagle Scout leadership projects throughout the community.

During the summer months, several of the troop young adults will be working as lifeguards, and as many as 17 scouts will be volunteering their time to work as staff members at Camp YawPaw in Mahwah, NJ.

In an audience with Cardinal Angelo Amato, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Pope Francis approved the publication of a decree on a miracle attributed to the intercession of Pope Paul VI (1897-1978).

The approval clears the way for his beatification, which will take place on October 19, at the conclusion of the Extraordinary Synod of Bishops on the family.
