CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

To all my Brother Knights, Columbiettes, Squires & Scouts,

I, (a 52 year member of our Order), not only welcome but congratulate all the new members of St. John's Council #1345, one of the best Councils in the State of New Jersey. You have joined the largest Catholic, Fraternal Service organization in the World (not even to mention the largest, lay order in the Mystical Body of Christ). During the past decade, the Order (Knights of Columbus) has donated more than \$1.325 billion to Charity and provided nearly 626 million volunteer hours (many of them yours).

Now to the heart of the message.

A few years ago, a very holy priest told us about the "Secret to Holiness" in the Columbia (the monthly magazine of the Knights of Columbus). So during the Holy Season of Lent, we started climbing the Mystic Mountain of Holiness by attending more Holy Masses, saying more Rosaries daily if possible for the Rosary defeated the superior Muslim Armada in 1571 and then the Saintly Pope Pius V gave us The Feast of the Holy Rosary – October 7. Fidelity to that same Holy Rosary will also defeat the Neo-Pagan Forces of the 21st Century.

And finally as we climb that Mystic Mountain of Holiness, we read the beautiful Gospel of St. Luke (15:11-32). Pope Benedict XVI says about the parable "perhaps the most beautiful of Jesus' parables". It is known as the Parable of the Prodigal Son. It would be better to be called "the Parable of the Good Father" (LOVE).

Incidentally, the quotes of the Pope are taken from his book "Jesus of Nazareth". You still have the whole month of March (31 plus days) before the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday – End of Lent, Good Friday, Holy Saturday). In those 31 days, you and I will continue to climb that Mystic Mountain of Holiness and pray that all young, middle age, and old make a Successful Journey and Become the Easter people that Christ suffered and died for. With Christ, you can hear more Holy Masses, say more Holy Rosaries and read more Scripture.

Quote of the month: "I am with you always, even to the end of the world" (St. Matthew 28:20).

So the next time my kids wake me up at 6am on a weekend, or my back goes out, or work keeps me up for 36 hours troubleshooting an issue I will try to stay focused on the meaning of Dayenu.
