CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

As we enter into the month of March we begin the holy season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is March 5 and the season will extend to Wednesday of Holy Week, April 16. A spiritual writer explains the season of Lent this way: "Lent is the time to create sacred space in our lives. The testing of Jesus and his fast in the desert are the example given to us whereby we can create this sacred space. Fasting whether it be from food or drink or from many of our selfish and self-centered impulses helps to make room in our hearts for God and his word. Repentance for our past sins removes the baggage that clutters up our lives and makes us take responsibility for ourselves and the consequences of our ill-considered free choices.

Furthermore, repentance reorients our lives away from self toward God by helping us realize and work on what comes between us and the Lord. Repentance turns the water of our tears into the wine of his divine love. The basic message that Jesus preaches is intended to make us more aware of the presence of God's kingdom among us and within us. By self-discipline and a change of heart regarding our past sins, we become all the more receptive to serving and promoting the kingdom of God, where the good news of love, mercy and forgiveness reign in the person of Jesus and in his body, the Church."

May this Lent be a time for us to rejuvenate our spiritual lives, to go deep within ourselves, make amends for past sins and open our hearts to loving God more as we celebrate the great Easter mystery that Christ suffered and died for us and rose from the dead out of love for us.
