Insurance Agent Report

Brothers Al...In this issue I'd like to talk about whole life insurance. The order offers four types of whole life.

<u>First</u> is traditional which is payable to age 100 or when you die. The <u>second</u> is a twenty pay product which you pay premiums for twenty years and then the policy is paid up for life. The <u>third</u> is a ten pay product which you pay premiums for ten years and then the policy is paid up for life. The <u>fourth</u> is life paid up at 65. You pay premiums to age 65 and you're paid up for life. You have to be younger than 53 years old to enroll in that one.

The advantage of these products is a forced savings plan attached to your policy. As an example take a 54 year old male non smoker in a twenty pay whole life product for \$25000 of coverage. The yearly premium is \$882.25 for twenty years equals \$17645.00. The guaranteed cash value in that policy after twenty years is \$16761.00. The difference between what you paid and your cash value account is \$884.00. If you divide that by the twenty years you paid in your cost for the insurance \$44.20 a year.

Also after the twenty years your policy is paid up, the cash value will continue to grow, and the death benefit is in place until you need

it. I used age 54 as a medium age. The numbers will vary based on age. This is also contingent on keeping your premiums paid on time.
