Troop 1345 Boy Scouts Report

Troop 1345 returns this fall with a very active program, following a full summer of activities. This past summer, the troop went to summer camp in Trumansburg, NY (near Ithaca), and went on two whitewater rafting trips along the Lehigh River (13 miles and 9 miles). During the summer months, there were 28 scouts that earned 109 merit badges, 21 special awards, and the troop earned special honors at summer camp for exemplary youth leadership and program participation.

There were 11 scouts that worked at summer camps in July and August (Daniel Adomilli, Sean Adomilli, Matt Bambling, Daniel Buda, Brendan Cervantes, Eric D'Anna, Matt Dreisbach, Justin Merkovsky, Trevor Moriarty, CJ Reissner, Ryan Ziemba). There were 4 scouts that worked as Lifeguards this summer (Matt Bambling, Matt Smith, Ryan Ziemba, Sam Zimmerman).

The troop leadership taught Red Cross Lifeguard classes in conjunction with the Dumont Swim Club and BSA Northern New Jersey Council this past summer, recertifying 14 lifeguards, training 12 new lifeguards, and training 5 lifeguards in waterfront skills.

The troop's 6 Eagle Scouts are all attending college this fall (Timmy Bright at Bloomsburg University, Domenic Fierro at McDaniel College, DJ Fusco at New Jersey Institute of Technology, John Benducci at Boston University, Ryan Ziemba at Embry Riddle Aeronautical University, and Sam Zimmerman at West Virginia University). Of special note is the fact that Ryan and Sam were both awarded BSA scholarships of \$1000 each towards their respective universities for their continued volunteer service and involvement in the community.

This past August, Colin Hilcken embarked on his Eagle Scout leadership project, in the hopes of becoming an Eagle Scout before he turns 18 in October. The first phase involved blood drives coordinated by Community Blood Services, where some 90 pints of blood was collected. The second phase involves a First Responder Day with the ambulance, police, and fire departments along with Community Blood Services. The third phase involves the procurement and installation of fiberglass markers on fire hydrants at select locations throughout town.
