#### **CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:**

Dear Brother Knights, Sister Columbiettes, Scouts, and Friends,

Last month, members of St. John's Council and their Columbiette auxiliary, hosted a Communion Breakfast following the 10am Mass at St. Mary's. The guest speaker at this breakfast was Kathy DiFiore, the founder of Several Sources; a foundation committed to helping unwed mothers and other women facing a crisis pregnancy. By hosting women in shelters, Several Sources Foundation provides an alternative for those women who are considering an abortion.

Ms. DiFiore brought with her a young woman who is currently living in a Several Sources Shelter and her infant daughter who was saved from an abortion through the efforts of her foundation. This young woman shared her story; a profound story of hope. She also introduced us to her beautiful daughter; a child that very easily could have been lost to the crime of abortion. This child was living proof that every child conceived has the right to be born. (see photo on page 4.)

As Catholic Christians, we have a duty to proclaim our Lord's Gospel of Life and we need to support those who put their faith into action as they work to protect the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death. Most importantly, we need to pray for those who are considering abortion as a solution to a crisis pregnancy.

We need to pray that they will realize that there are alternatives, that there is always hope and, that no matter what, God still loves them. We also need to pray that lawmakers will experience a change of heart and realize that all human life is a precious gift from God.
