CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

First I want to say that it is an honor and a pleasure to serve as the chaplain for the Knights of Columbus, St. John's council #1345. Many of you know me but some of you may not, thus I thought for this first article I would share a bit of my vocation story with you.

I felt called to the priesthood early on in life, sometime around the age of 8 while I was serving as an altar boy at my parish of St. Veronica's in Howell, N.J. At the age of 14 I applied to and was accepted to a seminary high school. I was due to enter in September, 1983, however, in August, 1983, the school burned to the ground and it was decided that it would not be rebuilt. I took this as a sign from God and went in a different direction for several years.

Fast forward to 2001, I am sitting in my parish of St. Michael's in Cranford, N.J. when the then vocation director for the Archdiocese is introduced and starts to give his vocation talk which I proceeded to ignore thinking in my head that at this point I am too old to enter seminary. Just as the thought ran through my head the priest states that there is a special program for older men so we should not think we are too old to enter the seminary and study for the priesthood. I got the message loud and clear and contacted the vocation director later that day and entered the seminary in September of 2002.

I would like to say that the rest is history, however, the story does not end there; for the transition from the life I was living (good career, my own home etc) to life as a seminarian was not an easy one. I was in all honesty ready to give up on the priesthood and return to my old life by the end of my first year of study when I received a sign not to give up. It came in the form of roses......which is a story I will tell you in next month's article.....

WE REMEMBER...Fr. John F. Murray, SMA...1923-2015



A Biography of Fr. John F. Murray, SMA by Joseph A. Luciano, K.H.S. Past State Deputy and State Historian

On May 16, 1968, Father John F. Murray, SMA was appointed State Father Prior of the Columbian Squires in New Jersey, by the newly elected State Deputy Frank J. Brady. Brady also appointed PGK Ralph Calucurcio from Lyndhurst Council No. 2396 State Chairman of the Squires. Together with their dynamic program Father Murray, Frank and Ralph went to great heights with the Columbian Squires movement. New Jersey ranked number one in the world with some 50 circles formed and received numerous awards from the Supreme Council.

Father Murray was born on January 23, 1923 in Flushing, New York to a family of devout Catholics. His parents John and Margaret Murray had 10 children; five boys and five girls. John became a Priest and three of his sisters became nuns. (Two to the Dominican Order and one to the Charity Order.) You can see how deep vocations were rooted in his family. He spent his youth in Flushing, NY attending Elementary School and High School there and graduating in 1941.

In December of 1941 he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. He served a short time and was honorably discharged because of sickness. After College his career in the field of youth started in 1944 by teaching at St. Joseph's House for Homeless Boys in Philadelphia, PA for five years. He enrolled study at Dunstan University, Prince Edward Island in Canada for two years, after which he entered the S.M.A. Seminary in Dedham, Massachusetts; graduating in 1950. He was ordained an S.M.A. Father in 1957.

Father Murray's first assignment was to St. Cyprianes' Church in Georgetown, South Carolina and later became pastor of St. Anthony's Church in Savannah, Georgia. He then left for Liberia, Africa on a two-year assignment and upon returning in 1961 was stationed at the Mission House in Doylestown, PA. Finally, he was moved to Tenafly, NJ to the Provincial House, Society of African Missions, where he has been for the last 46 years. From 1962 to 1967, he served as Vocations Director at the Mission House.

In 1958, Father Murray joined the Knights of Columbus. In 1964 he was appointed Chaplain of Carnation Council No. 1863, Fort Lee and of Madonna Council No. 5200 in Englewood. In the same year he became Father Prior of Dominic Savio Circle No. 1622 at St. John's Council No. 1345 in Bergenfield-Dumont. In 1986 he was appointed Chaplin of St. John's Council No. 1345 in Bergenfield-Dumont. Father received his Fourth Degree in 1965 (First New Jersey District) and in 1980 was appointed Faithful Friar of Pope John XXIII Assembly in Cliffside Park. In 2005 he was appointed Chaplain of the newly-chartered Columbiette Auxiliary of St. John's Council #1345. Father retired from all active duty in 2010.

One of Father Murray's favorite quotes is of Bishop Thomas J. Walsh from our 1922 Convention: "If the Knights of Columbus take care of the growing boy, the boy grown into manhood will take care not only of the Knights of Columbus but of the church and Nation as well."

You can see by his involvement in the Knights of Columbus that he loved the Order and because of his dedication to youth was appointed State Father Prior of the Columbian Squires thirty nine years ago. Until he retired, he served in that post with the same enthusiasm and dedication as when he started.

Fr. John F. Murray, SMA passed into eternal life on July 9, 2015. May he continue to watch over his flock of Knights, Columbiettes and Squires; may he rest in peace, Amen.

Again, he happily agreed, and we were thrilled that our friend and very special priest was able to be a part of our lives at both of these very joyous sacramental occasions.

I will always remember Fr Murray for being there for my family when my younger sister, Linda, died of breast cancer at the age of only 34 years old, with three little children, in May of 2002. Not only did Fr Murray attend the wake up in Ramsey, but he also conducted a prayer service for the benefit of my family, without my even asking him. Fr Murray had a heart of gold, and I will always remember him in that shining way! *Edward A. Trawinski, Jr.*

After Fr. Murray retired, he and I developed a very close friendship and relationship. We would talk on the phone every day except Sunday when he visited with his family. Sometimes he would have to leave a message on the cell phone, and he would say to me "I'd rather be talking with you than with a machine", so we set a time of 3:30pm each day for our calls. I was blessed with those calls....no matter what we talked about, it always ended with a spiritual message and a blessing. As an ardent Mets fan, it was tough-going trying to talk about the Yankees. Father had a way of deflecting that talk almost immediately. But through the years, I would always inject some Yankee news into our conversations. And finally in 2014 I hit the lottery when he admitted that he liked Joe Girardi, Yankee manager. I will treasure forever the memory of those daily phone calls and the impact he had on my life.
