Chaplain's Reflection

THE NECESSITY OF PERSEVERANCE

Perseverance. Here's a real challenge for us! Persevering in these very difficult times of our nation and Church's history is no easy task. After this past year, we can spend all the time we want asking the questions, "Why is this happening?" And, the ever repeated, "Would we ever had thought a year ago things could be like this?" But it gets us nowhere; persevering does.

To start, let us accept that we are in this position because of sin. It is a multidimensional web we are caught in. People want to go back to the way it was. It cannot happen. That is what the Apostles did after the Resurrection, and Jesus called them out on it. Things had to change. They saw Him die and rise and yet they still wanted to do their own thing without deep reflection on what was happening in front of them. We must do the same. We must decide for God. Be on our knees and beg forgiveness and for Him alone to change fix this mess. Believe me, no leader, party, institute, vaccine or science can fix the mess we are in. Only Jesus Christ. He will do it, but He waits our decision for Him alone. That means to live His commandments in truth, to stand uncompromised and even be willing to suffer for it.

There will be a great change coming soon. Life will be lived more beautifully different, not an existence submerged in a "new normal." But for this to happen, we must ask the Lord for the grace to persevere. Now, in order to grow and persevere in the life in the Spirit, we must undergird our perseverance with self-control. Perseverance is not a mysterious quality that just one day suddenly materializes. It results from faith, virtue, discernment, and self-control (2 Pt 1:5-6). Suffering is required but do it with joy. If during these tough days ahead, we accept the graces which lead to perseverance because of our love for God, He will do great things for us. "There is no limit to love's forbearance, to its trust, its hope, its power to endure" (1 Cor 13:7). "There are in the end three things that last: faith, hope, and love, and the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor 13:13).

Without perseverance, our lives are tragic, and even Jesus' death is in vain for us (1 Cor 1:17). If we run the race of the Christian life (see 2 Tm 4:7) but don't cross the finish line, we have run the race in vain. We should daily pray above all for the grace of final perseverance (see Lk 21:19). Let it be so. God bless you.
