CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE:

Dear Friends,

During this month of March, we honor St. Joseph, Foster Father of our Lord (March 19). Here is a beautiful reflection about him from Fr. Timothy Radcliffe O.P. former Master General of the Dominican Order: **St. Joseph: A Man of Honor...**

St. Joseph was "a righteous man." This is often translated as "a man of honor," someone who cared about his reputation. And so when he discovered that Mary was pregnant, he decided to do the right. To protect his good name, he would divorce her, and to protect her name, he would do so quietly, without making a fuss.

But obedience to God's messenger meant that he must jeopardize his own honor. He must take this woman who is pregnant, and not by him, into his home and raise her child. Ever since, Joseph has been open to mockery. He looks to the skeptical to be just what he would most have hated, a cuckold, an elderly man who has been made to look a fool.

Yet in embracing this destiny he is most closely identified with the son entrusted to him, who will die a shameful death on a cross, the most dishonorable fate imaginable. Joseph is shown to be just the father needed to raise a child who is Emmanuel, God with us, close to us in our shame and folly.

Joseph teaches us two ways in which we can prepare to join the company of Jesus (and I am not referring to the Jesuits!). First of all we must have care for other people's good name. For St. Thomas Aquinas, a person's reputation is his or her most prized possession, and to destroy it is not only unjust but robbery. Even if what we say about other people is true, and they have done terrible things, it is still wrong to destroy their name, unless there is some compelling necessity for the common good. We have to resist the succulent pleasure of passing on juicy gossip.

Every day the media casually destroy people's reputations, by accusation or insinuation. Celebrities are puffed up and then shot down. But Jesus took as his first companions those who had dirty reputations: prostitutes and tax collectors. Can we learn to shut our mouths and never say a word that will destroy the good name of another child of God, unless justice requires that we do so? Secondly we must dare to put our own good name in jeopardy. We must take the risk, like Joseph, of being misunderstood and made the butt of jokes. St. Teresa of Avila's Spain was obsessed with honor. People were deeply sensitive to any slur on their good name.

For Teresa this was rubbish, "children building houses of straw." The priests who worked with her were distressed to find themselves accused of awful things, but Teresa just laughed, because all that matters is how we are seen by God. And so let Joseph teach us how to welcome God's son into our lives, caring for everyone's reputation, and yet, if necessary, being unafraid to lose our own.

Congratulations to Jack Zimmerman who completed his Eagle Scout leadership project, assembling some 47,000 meal packages to be distributed to food insecure people throughout Northern New Jersey.

As part of his project, Jack spent months going around to various churches and community organizations, explaining about the hunger problem in Northern New Jersey, and showing a movie called "A Place At The Table".

Along the way, Jack raised over \$10,000 which was then used to purchase food product and supplies to assemble the 47,000 meals of rice and beans. The meals are easily distributed and ready to be cooked. Jack organized over 200 workers ranging in age from 8 to 88 to help with his project, including boy scouts, girl scouts, high school students, and adults from several congregations.

Troop 1345's winter program continued in February with a camping trip to Camp NoBeBoSco in Blairstown, NJ. During this trip, the scouts hiked on a portion of the Appalachian Trail along the Kittatiny Ridge, in the area of Rattlesnake Spring.
