## Chaplain Message

Brother Knights, Sister Columbiettes, Families, and Friends,

Have you ever thought of Lent as a yearly second chance? Each year the Church gives us six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. Since most of us find that we've wandered from God's path, Lent becomes that second chance, or do-over, to "return to God with our whole heart." That's how merciful God is! In fact, Jesus even gives us one of the best "second chances" to make a big difference in the discipline of fasting.

Fasting unfortunately is interpreted by people negatively when it is presented in the Church. When presented in fitness, it is hailed. What a shame. Fasting is in fact, a very powerful prayer that has physical, emotional and spiritual benefits. Jesus says in the Gospel, "When you fast..." Jesus never said "if you fast", hence this is an expectation from Jesus and rightly so.

Jesus also says in the gospel when told by his disciples that they had a difficult time delivering a demon from the man, that there are "certain demons that can only be removed by prayer and fasting." Mark 9:14. Let's face it: we all have our own demons that we battle. Some are within us in addictions, bad habits and vices like laziness, anger, lust etc.

These are the demons that will weaken and go away when we add the discipline of fasting as another form of prayer. Fasting also brings an inner joy and freedom to the heart. Fasting, when done in large numbers ie: city, nation, has the power to actually stop wars and even suspend natural weather events.

Some claim they cannot fast on food due to health. So why not a digital fast from cell phones, games, television and entertainment? That could be more powerful than food!

Make that "second chance" this Lenten season a memorable and profitable one by making a genuine effort to fast both for yourself and even for another person(s) who is ill, dying, suffering or oppressed by a demon of addiction, bad habits and vices. You will not be sorry. You will receive an abundance of strength and grace. Have a most Blessed Lenten Season!
