Chaplain's Reflection

THE ROSARY SOLVES ALL PROBLEMS - A Profound Message of Hope

October is the month of the Rosary. In fact, October 7th is the day that the Church celebrates this great feast. This date is significant. October 7th used to be celebrated as *Our Lady of Victories* until it was renamed *Our Lady of the Rosary* by Pius XII in the 1950's. Although the name is different the origin remains the same.

Pope Saint Pius V established this feast of *Our Lady of Victories* in 1573. The purpose was to thank God for the victory of Christians over the Turks at Lepanto—a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. This is one of the great historical events that prevented Europe from succumbing to Islamic takeover. I encourage all to read this event that was surely an act of God.

Sadly, people look down on the Rosary as if it were an old lady's prayer. Well if that is the case, there are a lot of militant old ladies out there! The Rosary which was simply designed by the Holy Trinity and given to the Church by Our Lady, was called "a weapon" by Our Lady from the beginning. It has enormous power because it is the prayer of Scripture/Gospel. Each prayer is from Scripture. The 150 Hail Mary's represent the 150 Psalms that David prayed - 50 in Joyful times, 50 in struggling/war times 50 in Triumphant glory times. Now fuse that with 15 (now 20) Gospel reflections, prayed from the heart and there is power unleashed!

The Rosary remains heaven's weapon in today's world designed to bring peace to the heart, decrease sin and increase virtue and bestow abundant miracles. In these very difficult times, do not fear. Turn to your Mother, Mary. Turn to the Rosary, you will not regret it! Sr. Lucia dos Santos, the seer of Fatima, in an interview many years ago with Fr. Fuentes, once encouraged all of us saying, "The Most Holy Virgin, in these last times in which we live, has given a new efficacy to the recitation of the Rosary to such an extent that there is no problem, no matter how difficult it is, temporal or especially spiritual, in the personal life of each one of us, of our families, of the families of the world or of the religious communities, or even of the life of peoples and nations, that cannot be solved by the Rosary.

There is no problem, I tell you, no matter how difficult it is, that we cannot resolve by the prayer of the Holy Rosary. With the Holy Rosary we will save ourselves. We will console Our Lord and obtain the salvation of many souls."

If you haven't yet, rediscover the Rosary. If you pray it daily, pray it all the more! Live these encouraging words from Our Blessed Mother. God bless you.
